For many years now, a large number of Iranian directors have been an integral part of the programme of the Berlinale and other festivals. Directors such as Abbas Kiarostami or Jafar Panahi are well known - and not only to top experts of world cinema. Yet how is the situation of Iranian cinema changing? Especially now, when the country has to cope with the inflexibility of the political system on the one hand, and impresses with the desire of many politically active citizens for change, on the other? How are filmmakers dealing with these issues? Will they be able to reflect the country's atmosphere and conflicts? Will we soon experience a new versatility in Iranian cinema?

At this event we will investigate these questions as well as many others.

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The *World Cinema Fund* was founded in October 2004 as a joint initiative of the German Federal Cultural Foundation and the Berlinale. It immediately established itself as one of the leading institutions funding outstanding international productions and rapidly gained recognition from those in the industry. Funding from the *WCF* has become something like a mark of quality.

Since its establishment, the *WCF* has awarded production and distribution funding to a total of 70 projects chosen from 1165 submissions from Africa, Latin America, the Middle East, Central and South East Asia, and the Caucasus. All of the *WCF* films completed so far have screened in cinemas and/or in the programmes of renowned international film festivals - proof of the international success of the initiative, like *Shekarchi (The Hunter)* by Rafi Pitts which will be presented in this year´s *Competition*, and most recently the winner of this year´s Berlinale *The Milk of Sorrow (La teta asustada*, Peru), which has, alongside *Ajami* (Israel), just received an Oscar nomination for Best Foreign Language Film.
