*WCF* Spotlight in Berlin: Berlinale *World Cinema Fund* Celebrates its 5<sup>th</sup> Anniversary

This autumn, the Berlinale *World Cinema Fund* turns five and is celebrating with a presentation of selected *WCF* films from 4 to 7 November in the "Hackesche Höfe Kino" in Berlin.

The *WCF* was established in October 2004 as an initiative of the German Federal Cultural Foundation and the Berlinale in cooperation with the Goethe Institut. Since then, 63 films from Africa, Latin America, the Middle East, Central and South Asia and the Caucasus have received production or distribution funding. These films have screened internationally in cinemas and/or programmes of renowned international film festivals.

In little time, the *WCF* has established itself as a facilitator in the cultural-political sector, a seal of approval for projects receiving support and an initiative to promote contacts in the international film industry. To mark this 5<sup>th</sup> anniversary, the Berlinale, together with the German Federal Cultural Foundation, is organizing a *WCF* spotlight called *Infectious Films*. It will highlight ten *WCF* films to give cineastes and Berlin audiences a taste of the authentic stories and artistic strengths of *WCF*-supported productions.

"The more local, the more international: The *WCF* believes that films that show one's own cultural identity, in all its fluctuations, can move and infect international audiences as well," says Festival Director Dieter Kosslick.

"Every film supported by the *World Cinema Fund* shows determination and artistic courage and opens a window into a world that we otherwise wouldn't be able to experience in German cinemas. These five years also show that *WCF* is a cultural-political success story: German producers are systematically involved in the funding programme and thereby hold their ground in the international film industry," comments Hortensia Völckers, Artistic Director of the German Federal Cultural Foundation.

The WCF spotlight Infectious Films will open on Wednesday, 4 November at 8 p.m. with an introduction by famous director of photography Michael Ballhaus in "Hackesche Höfe Kino". It will be followed by the premiere of this year's Berlinale winner The Milk of Sorrow (La teta asustada) by Claudia Llosa, in cooperation with the distributor Neue Visionen, who will release this Peruvian film the next day in German cinemas nationwide.
