

Berlinale Co-Production Market 2011 to Assist 38 Selected Film Projects Find Co-Production Partners

At the eighth *Berlinale Co-Production Market* (February 13 to 15, 2011), the producers and directors of 38 selected film projects from 25 countries worldwide will meet with 450 potential co-production and financing partners.

For each of these projects, the *Berlinale Co-Production Market* team will arrange numerous one-on-one meetings with interested potential partners. The schedule for the over 1000 meetings in two days will be tailored to the concrete individual needs and wishes of the participants, and the priorities of the projects.

Besides these individual project meetings, there will be a "Company Matching" event at this year's *Berlinale Co-Production Market* for the first time. At it three prestigious production companies will be presented that have already created extensive networks around the world. These companies are all open to establishing further connections and keen on new partnerships. "In the exact same way as with their projects, participants can request meetings with the selected production companies. Yet these meetings will not revolve around concrete projects but around becoming acquainted with each other's companies so as to find structural similarities and possibly open up perspectives for future collaborations," says project director Sonja Heinen. The participants selected for "Company Matching" will be announced in late January.

In 2011, the official selection of projects for the *Berlinale Co-Production Market* includes 24 exciting new feature film projects (chosen from a total of 352 entries). They will be presented by internationally experienced producers who already have at least 30% of their financing in place. The projects all have budgets between one and twelve million euros.

Among these are projects by well-known, award-winning directors such as Lucía Puenzo (XXY and recently The Fish Child - Panorama 2009), Eran Riklis (The Syrian Bride, Lemon Tree), Urszula Antoniak (Nothing Personal) and Seyfi Teoman, whose film Bizim Büyük Çaresizliğimiz (Our Grand Despair) has just been completed and will screen in this year's Competition.

In conjunction with CineMart Rotterdam, three other projects have been chosen for the "Rotterdam-Berlinale Express"; they will participate in both the CineMart and the *Berlinale Co-Production Market*.

In cooperation with the *Berlinale Talent Campus*, eleven projects by newcomers have been selected from 270 additional entries for the "Talent Project Market".

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At least two films from previous *Berlinale Co-Production Markets* will be presented at this year's Berlinale: Israeli director Nir Bergman's *Intimate Grammar*, which has already won awards at festivals in Jerusalem and Tokyo, will be screening in *Generation Kplus*. Rosario Garcia-Montero met her co-producers from Barry Films, Germany, while taking part in the "Talent Project Market" in 2007. Her film *Las Malas Intenciones/The Bad Intentions*, which has just been completed, was backed by the Berlinale's *World Cinema Fund* and is now returning to Berlin to celebrate its world premiere in *Generation Kplus*.

Overall, the success rate of the *Berlinale Co-Production Market* is impressive: 40% of the projects selected in the past, i.e., over 100 films, have been realised.

In addition to the pre-arranged individual meetings, there will be many other networking opportunities at the *Berlinale Co-Production Market* on February 13 and 14, as well as an up-to-date programme of information on the latest trends in film financing, marketing and international co-productions. According to the participants' individual timetables during the Berlinale, they can put together their own personal programme out of the many events offered, one that suits both their needs and interests.

On February 15, everything will revolve around film rights for literary adaptations for the sixth time. At "Breakfast & Books", which is organised in cooperation with the Frankfurt Book Fair, ten selected bestsellers and top new releases will be presented that provide producers with potentially interesting material for the screen.

The main partners of the *Berlinale Co-Production Market* are MDM - Mitteldeutsche Medienförderung and the MEDIA Programme of the European Union.

The Berlinale Co-Production Market is part of the European Film Market. The Berlin House of Representatives - directly across from the European Film Market in the Martin-Gropius-Bau - will again be the Co-Production Market's cooperation partner and venue.
