Berlinale World Cinema Fund: Latest Jury Decisions

At the 15th session of the *World Cinema Fund* (*WCF*) jury, five new film projects were selected for production funding.

Since its establishment in October 2004, the *WCF* has awarded production and distribution funding to a total of 93 projects chosen from 1,651 submissions from Africa, Latin America, the Middle East, Central and South East Asia, and the Caucasus. All of the *WCF* films completed so far have screened in cinemas and/or in the programmes of renowned international film festivals and are proof of the international success of the initiative.

Latest Funding Decisions

The *WCF* jury made their selection from 113 submissions from a total of 38 countries and awarded production funds totalling $210,000 \in$. Jury members are film scholar and curator Viola Shafik (Germany/Egypt), documentary producer Marta Andreu (Spain), distributor and producer Jan De Clercq (Belgium) and *WCF* project managers Sonja Heinen and Vincenzo Bugno.

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Thanks to the support of new cooperation partners - the Federal Ministry for Economic Cooperation and Development, and the Deutsche Welle/DW-AKADEMIE - the *WCF* launched a new programme in a number of African countries this August: *WCF*-Factories, aimed at promoting the creative and structural autonomy of African cinema.

In August, the first *WCF*-Factory was held in Burundi. Together with its local partner CoProDac, the *WCF* had selected the feature film *Amaguru n'Amaboko* (*Feet and Hands*) by Rolland Rugero. During its shoot, training was provided for sound techniques. In October, the second *WCF*-Factory was held in Burkina Faso: In cooperation with the local partner Imagine Film Institute in Ouagadougou, an editing workshop was organised during the shoot of Appoline Traoré's *Moi, Zaphira*.
