After a Successful 2013, World Cinema Fund Gets Off to a Smashing Start in 2014

For the World Cinema Fund (WCF), 2013 proved to be an exceedingly successful year: the WCF-funded film Uroki Garmonii (Harmony Lessons) by Emir Baigazin took home the Silver Bear at the last Berlinale.

Also the Berlinale 2014 could not have got off to a better start. For the first time two *WCF*-funded films will be screening in the *Competition* of the Berlinale: Celina Murga's *La tercera orilla* (*The Third Side of the River*, Argentina / Germany / Netherlands), and Benjamin Naishtat's directorial debut, *Historia del miedo* (*History of Fear*, Argentina / Uruguay / Germany / France).

Showing in *Panorama* is the German-Turkish production *Kuzu* (*The Lamb*) by Kutluğ Ataman; and in *Forum*, *Chilla* (*40 Days of Silence*) by Saodat Ismailova, co-produced by Uzbekistan, Tadzhikistan, Netherlands, Germany and France.

The *WCF* invites all friends of the *WCF*, as well as international representatives of the trade and press to *WCF* Day on February 12, 2014. After welcoming words from Festival Director Dieter Kosslick, and *WCF* project managers Sonja Heinen and Vincenzo Bugno, Jorge Sánchez, director of the Instituto Mexicano de Cinematografía will present the IMCINE Award. This new prize will be awarded by IMCINE to all Mexican films that receive funding from the *World Cinema Fund* in the next three years. The IMCINE-Award is endowed with 15,000 Euro.

Following the presentation, two *WCF* panel discussions will be held (in English).
